INTRODUCTION

The information provided in this document is aimed to assist you with planning your group's visit to the Ipswich Art Gallery.

It is the responsibility of those teachers/carers bringing visiting groups, particularly school groups, to be aware of the health and safety of all those under their care. Teachers and carers are responsible for displaying and maintaining safe and appropriate behavior for their group.

Temporary vehicle set down is located on Limestone Street adjacent to the RSL Park (corner of Limestone and Nicholas Streets). Traffic lights regulate pedestrian crossing. A large lift services all levels of the Gallery.

Adjacent to the Gallery Forecourt is a shaded area suitable for eating breaks. The RSL Park is also shaded (seating onto grass). Note the park is situated across the road from the Gallery and traffic lights regulate pedestrian crossing.

When you arrive:

- Please arrive **20 minutes** prior to your program commencement time to allow for ticketing, bathroom visits, bag cloaking etc.
- Assemble your group on the Gallery Forecourt (foyer in wet weather) and check-in at Gallery reception.
- Bags and umbrellas must be cloaked on arrival.
- No food or drink is allowed in the Gallery except for bottled water.
- Students must leave items such as hats, food, and all ink pens in their bags.
- Bathrooms are located on the Lower Ground floor of the Gallery.
- Teachers must supervise students at all times.

While you are here:

Please remember that student behaviour and safety is the responsibility of teachers for the duration of your visit.

The recommended minimum student: teacher/adult radios are:

5:1 (Kindergarten – Year 3)

10:1 (Year 4 – 7) 15:1 (Year 8 – 12)

Please share the following information with your students:

Please do not touch the artworks. Artworks can be damaged even by the slightest touch – so please look with your eyes only.

Walk, don't run. Consider your own safety and other Gallery visitors by walking through the Gallery.

No flash photography. The light from a flash can damage artworks so please only use non-flash photography. Also, for copyright reasons photographs should include more than one artwork.

Visual Arts Diaries and pencils. Students are encouraged to bring their own Visual Arts Diaries to record aspects of their visit. To do so, please use pencil only – no pens.

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TOILET POLICY

Students are to be accompanied and supervised by a teacher/carer when visiting the toilets at the Gallery. (The Gallery has wheelchair access and toilets for person(s) with a disability are available. Public toilets are located inside the Gallery).

FIRST AID

The Gallery has a number of first aid trained staff who are available to treat visitors, staff and contractors at the Gallery. There are multiple first aid kits located throughout the Gallery.

We ask that you inform Gallery staff should a first aid/medical situation arise during your visit. A supervisor from the group is required to remain with the sick/injured group member.

In the unlikely event of a major illness or injury, the Ipswich Art Gallery utilizes the Queensland Ambulance Service.

First Aid supplies are monitored by Gallery staff through regular checks (every 3 months). Extra supplies are ordered for periods of peak visitation.

FIRE SAFETY AND EMERGENCY EVACUATION

Fully trained Emergency Wardens and Assistant Wardens (Gallery staff) have the responsibility to direct students and visitors in emergency situations at the Gallery. Clearly marked emergency exit signs are located throughout the Gallery. Emergency exists are monitored daily by Gallery staff.

Emergency alert tone and evacuation alarm systems are in place at the Gallery.

Students and visitors would follow the instructions of the trained Emergency Wardens and Assistant Wardens should an emergency arise or if evacuation of the building is deemed necessary.

Should the emergency alert tone or the evacuation alarm sound during your visit, the teacher/carer would be directed by the Emergency Wardens or Assistant Wardens stationed in your vicinity. The teacher/carer is responsible for directing their group members in accordance with the instructions given by the Emergency Warden or Assistant Warden.

Lifts should not be used in a fire emergency.

CONSTRUCTION/MAINTENANCE/REPAIR

Licensed personnel are used for all constructions, maintenance and repair.
